



Social engineering is a common technique malicious actors use to gain the trust of employees, offering valuable lures or using impersonation to gain access to valuable personal information. Employees need to be educated on security awareness topics that cover the most common social engineering techniques and the psychology of influence. For instance, scarcity, urgency, and reciprocity, to combat these threats.

For example, by posing as a viable client or offering incentives, private information can unwittingly be handed over to these malicious actors. Increasing employee awareness of the threat of these impersonations is critical in reducing the risk of social engineering.

THE GINKGO

For a tree with historic, botanical, environmental and aesthetic significance, the Ginkgo is the perfect choice. It's the sole survivor from a group of trees that thrived 66 to 245 million years ago during the dinosaur era. With recorded specimens over 3,500 years old, the Ginkgo is a living fossil. Belonging to the Ginkgoaceae family, it absorbs 2800 kilos of CO2 every twenty years, making it an excellent anti-smog tree. With unique fan-shaped leaves, vibrant green in spring and summer and brilliant golden hues in autumn, the Ginkgo is widely regarded as one of nature's most beautiful trees.
